### Goals

1. Create a TED student listserve to inform students of leadership opportunities within TED, upcoming events, and relevant information to students and new professionals.
2. Conduct search for incoming Student Representatives. Select representatives from applications submitted and notify them of their appointment.
3. Conduct Call for Proposals for Kaleidoscope Sessions at the 2008 Council for Exceptional Children's Teacher Education Division (TED) National Conference; assign proposals to reviewers; compile list of accepted proposals; notify presenters of proposal status.
4. Collaborate with Chris Denning and Maya Osh, Senior TED representatives to develop a program and format for the TED Kaleidoscope in Dallas, Texas.
5. Collaborate with Lyndal Bullock and the Conference Committee to create a program and make room arrangements for the 2008 Kaleidoscope Session at the TED Conference, Milwaukee.
6. Mentor incoming Student Representatives and conduct Orientation Session at 2008 TED National Conference.

### Accomplishments:

1. Mentored incoming student representatives and conducted orientation session during the 2008 TED National Conference.
2. Conducted Call for Proposals for the CEC Kaleidoscope. 46 proposals were submitted by graduate students from 21 universities. The proposals were reviewed by 39 doctoral student reviewers from 12 universities. Of the 46 proposals that were submitted, 42 were accepted initially. Four proposals were provided the opportunity to revise and resubmit the proposal. One proposal was resubmitted and accepted. There will be 8 round table discussions during 2 concurrent 30-minute sessions as well as 32 poster presentations.
3. Created program for the Kaleidoscope session that included poster presenters, round table presenters, faculty panel participants, dissertation award winner, and Kaleidoscope reviewers.

4. Contacted all presenters regarding presentation times, participation in University Raffle, and presentation requirements or needs.

Discussion/Action Items:

1. Will continue to work with the publications committee to create a TED student e-community to inform students of leadership opportunities within TED, upcoming events, and relevant information to students and new professionals.
2. Will continue to work with the TED Board to find opportunities for increased student involvement within committees.
3. Participation of TED dissertation winner during the Kaleidoscope program. Whether winner presents dissertation or participates in the faculty panel.
